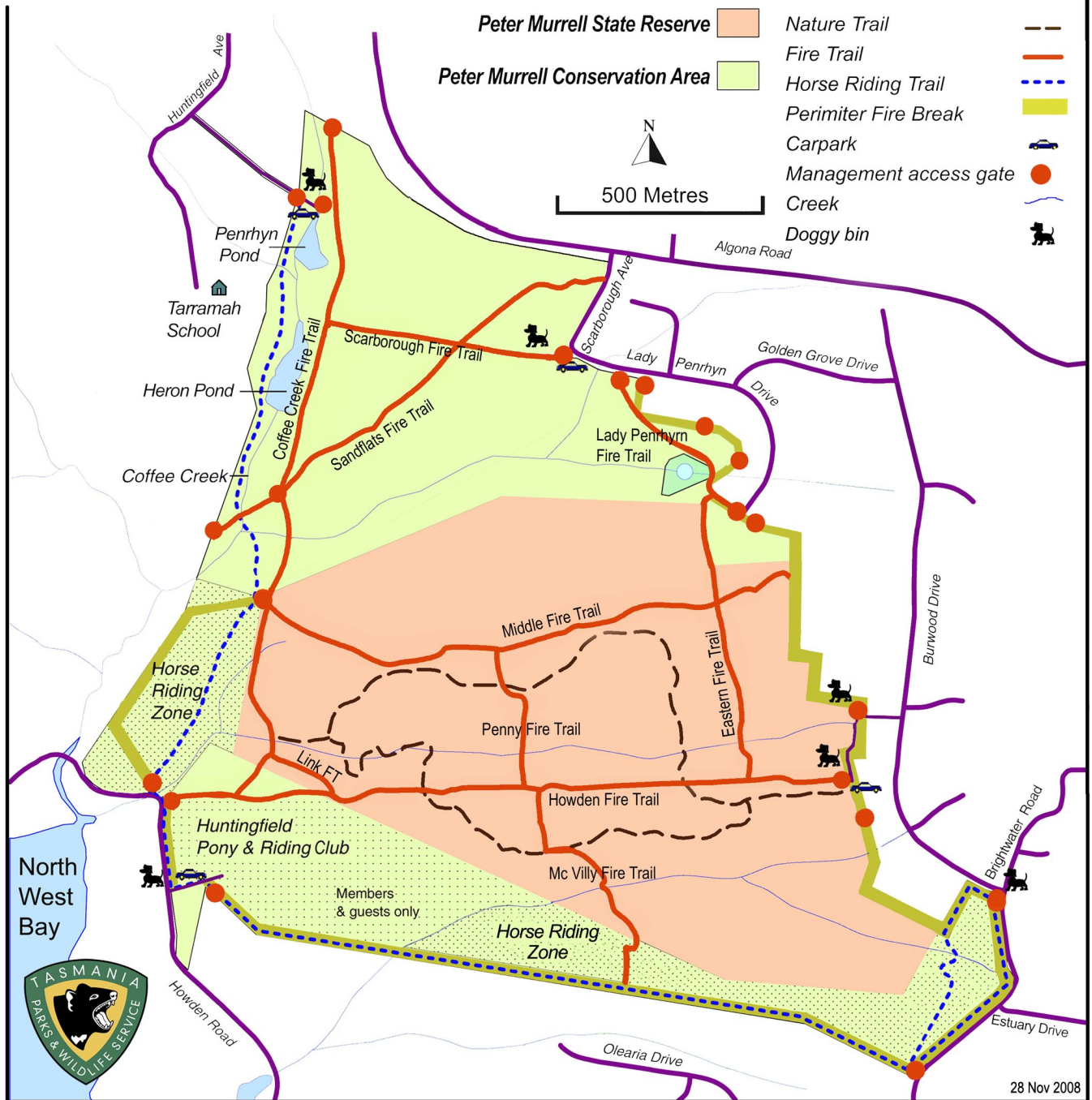

Conservation & Recreation

The permanent inhabitant wildlife and their habitat vegetation live between the Perimeter Fire Break, designated trails and other facilities provided for visitors to these reserves.

By remaining within the recreational areas provided the visitor has the opportunity to experience a variety of recreational activities whilst protecting and enjoying the natural environment.

For the protection of wildlife, dogs are not permitted into the bush, on the banks of or into Penrhyn Pond and Heron Pond.

Fire Trails are unobstructed named vehicular tracks.

Nature Trail is intended for the use of walkers only. Dogs, horses or bicycles are not permitted. Marker posts with pictogram and directional arrow indicate the route.

Bush regeneration. The trail systems cross tracks or run beside areas being rested for habitat rehabilitation, these are indicated by rock or other barrier. Please assist nature to heal itself by keeping off these areas.

Walking - Walking is allowed on all designated trails and the Perimeter Fire Break

Cycling - Cycling is allowed on Fire Trails and the Perimeter Fire Break.

Cyclist should give way to all other users

Angling - Angling is allowed only in Penrhyn Pond for disabled persons and juveniles as per Inland Fisheries Regulations.

Horse Riding - Horse riding is only allowed on the Horse Riding Trail and in the Horse Riding Zone.

Dog Walking - Dog walking is permitted on:

- 1. Named Fire Trails** - dogs on the leash at all times
- 2. Perimeter Fire Break** - dogs to be on leash or under effective control at all times.
- 3. Along section of Horse Riding Trail west of Coffee Creek** - dogs on the leash at all times

Dog walkers must remove dog faeces from the Reserves or drop them in bins where provided
